


Located in Williamsport, PA, the Matt Anderson Baseball Academy seeks to offer a high level of baseball instruction to the region's baseball players. The lead instructor and owner of the academy is Matt Anderson, full-time professional baseball scout for the Florida Marlins.

Matt has 16 years of experience in professional baseball having worked for the Atlanta Braves, Montreal Expos, and Florida Marlins.

Prior to working in professional baseball, Matt was the head baseball coach at Benedictine College in Atchison, KS. In 5 years from 1991 to 1995, Matt led the Benedictine College Ravens to a record of 129-108, winning Coach of the Year honors 3 times.

Matt's playing career included two years at the University of Oklahoma, where he was selected team captain his senior year in 1988 and was voted as a 1st team GTE Academic All-American. Matt's baseball education continued when he was hired as a graduate assistant baseball coach for the Sooners in 1989 following his playing career.

All these experiences brought by Matt Anderson to Anderson Baseball have created a depth of baseball knowledge now offered to prospective campers.

<p>4TH ANNUAL PRO SHOWCASE</p> <p>Where: In The Net, 798 Airport Road Palmyra, PA 17078-9785</p> <p>When: Saturday, November 5, 2011</p> <p>Time: Registration 8:30am, Camp 9a-4p</p> <p>Cost: \$175</p> <p>Staff: Pro Scouts, Coaches, Matt Anderson</p>	<p>The Matt Anderson Baseball Academy will be hosting a Showcase Evaluation Camp on Saturday, November 5, 2011 at "In the Net" Sports Complex in Palmyra, PA. The morning session will focus on evaluating each player's baseball skills. Position players will run the 60 yard dash, field and throw from their respective position, and hit in the cages. Pitchers will warm-up and throw a bullpen for evaluation. Each player's evaluation will be done by professional baseball scouts. The morning session will be very similar to a professional baseball tryout camp. The goal is to be able to give each player an honest assessment of his abilities. The afternoon session will include a pitching discussion, hitting evaluation and culminate with a controlled scrimmage. Scouts and college coaches will see players in real game type situations. The Anderson Baseball Pro Showcase is different from the typical showcase because we offer more than running the 60yd dash, fielding 5 groundballs and getting 10 swings. Players are active for most of the day. There is very little "sitting around".</p> <p>This camp occurs during the NCAA Division I recruiting period and we expect many college coaches to attend. The goal of this camp is three-fold: 1) to give the prospective players the opportunity to learn from professional baseball instructors; 2) to give the prospective player the opportunity to gain an honest evaluation from professional baseball scouts of his abilities and future; 3) to give the prospective player the opportunity to showcase his skills for professional baseball scouts and Division I college coaches.</p>	<p>**Advance Registration is required!**</p> <p>Email: matt@andersonbaseball.net</p> <p>Download a registration form at www.AndersonBaseball.net</p>

<p>PRO SKILLS INSTRUCTION CAMP</p> <p>Where: LANCO Fieldhouse, 1901 Miller Rd East Petersburg, PA 17520-1330</p> <p>When: Saturday, December 3, 2011</p> <p>Session 1 – 8:30am to 12:15pm</p> <p>Session 2 – 1:45pm to 5:30pm</p> <p>Cost: \$110 one session, \$190 both sessions</p> <p>Staff: Pro Scouts, Coaches, Matt Anderson</p>	<p><u>Session 1 – Pitching and Defense</u></p> <p>The morning session will focus on pitching and defense. Pitching commences with a mechanics talk/demonstration then moves to all pitchers throwing a simulated 3 inning bullpen with supervision, consultation and coaching from professional scouts. The pitching segment ends with a Q & A session on the mental game and the scouting/recruitment process. Catchers begin with a mechanics talk/demonstration with hands on training that focuses on blocking, framing and throwing. The catchers will also participate in the simulation bullpens. Infielders and outfielders will begin with a mechanics demonstration focusing on proper throwing and fielding techniques. The defensive segment ends with an extensive pro infield/outfield that includes a little competition.</p> <p><u>Session 2 – Hitting and Offense</u></p> <p>The afternoon session focuses on the offensive part of the game. Each camper will rotate between hitting, bunting and base running stations. Each player will take a large number of swings with immediate feedback from pro instructors. The fundamentals of a sound swing that generate maximum bat speed at the point of contact are emphasized. A balance between power and contact will be highlighted. The offensive session concludes with an intense cage baseball game (and winners will be crowned).</p>	<p>Make sure to check the website for updates as to the staff of the Pro Skills Camp.
